Your petitioner, Mary E Phillips respectfully represents to Your Honorable Board, that she is a citizen of Waker County, in the State of

Alabama, and was such on the 1st day of January, 1899; that she is the widow of

Martin M. Phillips who served as a private in Company F of the 56 Regiment Ala

Volunteers; that her husband was killed, or died on the Feb. day of 1866

that he did not desert the service of the State of Alabama, nor of the Confederate States; that she has not since remarried; and that she has no children upon whom she can depend for support; that all of her property does not exceed four hundred dollars in value; and that her annual income from all sources does not exceed four hundred dollars. She therefore respectfully asks Your Honorable Board to place her name upon the Pension Rolls of the State as member of the fourth class, that she may participate in the division of the fund provided for the relief of needy Confederate soldiers and sailors, and their widows, by an Act of the General Assembly of Alabama, approved February 10th, 1899, and amended March 5th, 1901.
